## Hazards:

1. Main stairwell – poor lighting of steps under certain weather conditions and around dusk.
2. Lower steps – lack of handrails
3. Causeway – uneven surface and prone to flooding on high spring tides and/or with high seas.
4. Openings in outer wall – possible to climb / fall through.

## Groups at Risk:

1. Senior citizens and the partially sighted at medium risk, all others at low risk.
2. Senior citizens, people with mobility problems at medium risk.
3. Senior citizens, people with mobility problems at low risk.
4. Senior citizens, people with mobility problems.
5. Young children and toddlers at medium risk
6. Young children and toddlers at medium risk

## Action Taken:

The Historic Sites Manager is in the process of addressing these issues.

- School Groups are advised to check the tides when booking and asked to bring appropriate numbers of supervisory staff.
- At least one member of staff in the Fort is trained in First Aid and evacuation procedures and is available to accompany groups.

NB Fort Grey complies with the requirements of the 'Salle Publique' law which sets the criteria for premises open to public access.
