April 21 st 1874	Gulf of Nicoya	List of clothing left on board the ship by the said Joseph Green. 2 jackets 1 counterpane 1 blanket 3 pair drawers 2 singlets 3 pair of trousers 1 blue shirt 1 jumper 1 belt 3 pair socks 1 pair of stockings he also left oilskins sold on board the ship for three shillings. June 1 st 1874 5 p.m.	Lat. 38 11 S Long 97 24 W	Ship laboring heavily the stone jar containing vinegar was accidentally broken in consequence of which no vinegar could be issued to the crew after the 19 th of June the remainder (one quart) being kept as medical stores. June 22 nd 1874 2 p.m.	Lat. 48 20 S Long. 47 10 W	Edward Wicks steward was dismissed from the cabin for embezzlement and neglect of the ship's stores committed to his care besides through carelessness destroyed the greater part of the cabin utensils and also his being excessively impudent. I therefore sent him in the fore-castle as boy, and take Alfred Davies to act as steward for the remainder of the voyage. John Giffard Master John N Brouard Mate
